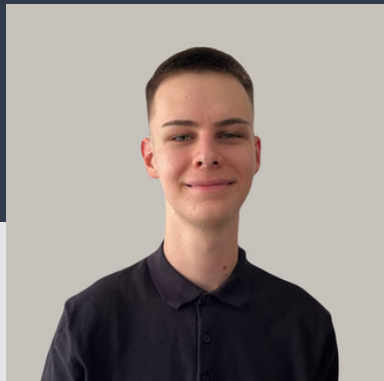

SUMMARY

Frontend Developer (React, TypeScript, Next.js) with commercial experience across three production environments: a multi-module CRM platform for SMB clients, a HIPAA-compliant healthcare application, and a client website delivered solo from requirements to launch. Hands-on with the full feature lifecycle — UI architecture, REST API integration, i18n localization (EN/UK), and backend work in Nest.js. Completed a B.Sc. in Cloud Application Development (2026). Open to frontend or full-stack roles in Wrocław or remote, with room to keep growing as a developer.

Multi-module CRM platform for business clients (pre-release)

- Cut the main production bundle from 685 KB to 341 KB gzipped by converting 35 page routes to React.lazy + Suspense code splitting, improving first-paint on login.
- Restructured a 149-component codebase into domain-based architecture via atomic per-domain PRs, reducing root-level files from ~120 to 21 and documenting the convention.
- Hardened EN/UK localization: migrated hard-coded strings to i18next, fixed language persistence across signup/onboarding, and added a CI check that fails builds on non-localized strings.
- Eliminated all react-hooks/exhaustive-deps violations (fixing real stale-closure bugs) and promoted the rule to error, blocking a recurring bug class from new PRs.
- Resolved 20+ production defects across Deals, Properties, and Profile modules — including timezone conversion, modal navigation, and data-categorization bugs — verified against QA repro steps.

Patient data de-identification platform for healthcare providers (under NDA)

- Implemented passwordless magic-link authentication end-to-end (React + Nest.js), including verification emails, link expiry, and automatic session termination after 2h of inactivity to protect patient-facing accounts.
- Built the 4-step patient-data de-identification flow from Figma designs — form handling, step navigation, and responsive layouts across desktop and tablet.
- Developed the main dashboard with information-card overview per the new design system.
- Implemented session-expired and link-expired states with responsive layouts, covering inactivity timeouts and invalid-session recovery.
- Shipped through two client demo cycles, iterating on auth, sidebar, and email templates from stakeholder feedback.

- Designed and shipped a 4-page commercial website solo, from client requirements to production deployment — achieving Lighthouse scores of 99 Performance / 100 Best Practices / 91 Accessibility.
- Built a mobile-first layout across 3 breakpoints with consistent rendering on iOS Safari, Chrome, Firefox, and Edge.
- Engineered modular UI sections and interactive modals in vanilla JavaScript — no framework, keeping the bundle minimal and load times near-instant on mobile networks.
- Structured semantic HTML5 and BEM-style CSS architecture, making content updates straightforward for the client post-handoff.
- Managed the client relationship end-to-end: requirements, revision cycles, scope, and final delivery on the agreed timeline.
